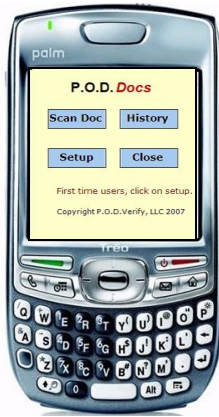
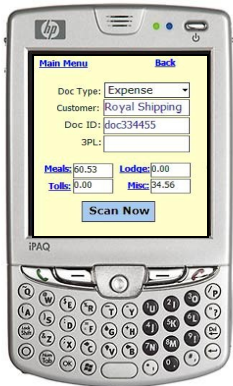

COMPANY SAFETY POLICY

"NO WAVE"

When driving a company vehicle or personal vehicle on company-related business, do not wave or motion another vehicle into traffic. If you encounter this situation do not allow entry, or observe area and allow sufficient distance to provide other drivers clear visibility. **DO NOT WAVE OR MOTION THE OTHER DRIVER INTO TRAFFIC.** allow the other driver time and distance to make their own responsible decision to proceed into traffic lanes.

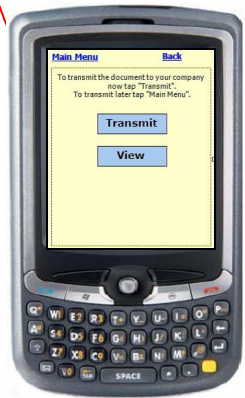
Where does the law stand on this issue?

Courts hold that a driver who gratuitously waves to another driver in an effort to help the waving driver's course of passage assumes a duty of care. Once this duty is undertaken, the waving driver must act reasonably under all circumstances involving the drivers.

The court found that a conviction when a driver is open to two different interpretations. First, it could mean that the driver can proceed beyond the signaling driver's vehicle. Alternatively, it could mean that it is safe for the waving driver to pull in front of the signaling driver's vehicle and remain there. Because there are reasonable interpretations, the court said, summary judgment is inappropriate.

The court disagreed with defendant's argument that the other driver did not rely on the wave or motion signal because of hesitation or stopping vehicle to independently view the traffic. That hesitation, stopping and independently looking does not negate the accountability of an otherwise liable signaling party. Further, because other driver stopped and independently looked for traffic, does not preclude a finding that he relied on the signal. The court concludes, genuine issues of material fact exist as to whether other driver relied on employee's signal. *Boucher v. Genm, 74 F.P.Supp. 2d 444 (D.N.J., 1999).*
